Secure Communications Guidelines

General Guidelines:

- ALWAYS ERR ON THE SIDE OF CAUTION when corresponding with missionaries.
 - We must use caution in communication to make sure we are not compromising their ministry or national believers.
 - When sending a bulk email, NEVER allow email addresses to be visible ALWAYS use BCC option.
 - Never criticize other faiths in any correspondence.
- Email correspondence to a missionary should be done through their agency assigned email address.
 - They are stored on a server in the U.S. which means it is more secure when you are out of country.
 - Other emails (such as gmail.com) are stored in the closest server making them more vulnerable to monitoring.
 - ATTENTION: the caveat to the above anytime an email is accessed on a mobile device (cellphone, iPad, android, etc.) you negate any security measures you may have in place.
- Use Communication Security Levels document as a reference to know what countries are considered sensitive.
 - Follow guidelines for communicating with missionaries in sensitive areas.
 - Take cues from missionaries by the way they are corresponding.
 - Check with the agency's Director of Global Security if you are unsure about the area's security level.
- It is recommended that missionaries in Level 2 and 3 use a VPN when sending email or communicating via internet.
- In level 2 or 3 country, do not download email to a program such as Outlook. It will store your email on your device rendering it visible to anyone with access to your device.

Communication Security Levels:

Level 1: Open Communication

- Presence of missionary and evangelism is openly known and practiced (religious visa).
- No restrictions on communication to/from the field.
- Full name, city, country and photo can be used for email correspondence, print and electronic publications.

Level 2: Cautious Communication

- Environment is tolerant but suspicious toward evangelism. Persecution is sparse but possible.
- ONLY first name and region name should be used in electronic correspondence & publications (ie. David Wilson in Kenya, should be changed to Dave in East Africa).
- Pseudonyms used for nationals in print and electronic publications.
- Photos of missionaries used in print publications ONLY.
- The following countries are examples of Level 2:

Level 3: Restricted Communication

- Environment is intolerant and antagonistic toward evangelism. Persecution can be moderate to extreme.
- ONLY first name and region name are used in email correspondence and all publications.
- NO PHOTOS of missionaries or nationals should be used in electronic publications.
- Pseudonyms used for nationals in print and electronic publications.
- Correspondence with missionaries in restricted areas must adhere to the LEVEL 3 Communication Guidelines.
- The following countries are examples of Level 3 along with suggested region substitute:

Communication Guidelines specific to LEVEL 3

When corresponding with missionaries in Security Level 3 countries:

- Be aware that all forms of communication have potential to be monitored that includes mail, email, and video conference.
- Use pseudonyms when referring to nationals.
- Do not mention or reference Christian organizations by name.
- Do not give out or place the missionary's names, addresses or email anywhere without permission.
- Avoid sending bulk emails. Separate email lists will be created and used for Security Level 3.
- Replace potentially harmful "Christian" terms with the following:
